The Action Centre (AC) newsletter is created and developed by its members to keep our donors, partners, members and the disabled community at large informed about our organization's successes and our fundraising campaigns.

Created in 1998 by the Constance Lethbridge Rehabilitation Centre, the AC community day centre was set up to service adults living with physical or cognitive disabilities from all over Montreal. Located in LaSalle, we are the only bilingual centre of its kind in Montreal. We now assist over 140 members by offering social and psychological rehabilitation through a variety of courses, programs and outings. The AC operates on the belief that everyone has the potential to make a contribution to society. A strong emphasis is placed on empowering members to be part of the team. We strive to help those who are trying to help themselves.

Living with a disability myself and using a wheelchair full time, I know first hand how easy it is to feel isolated. The AC offers an opportunity to break the vicious cycle of isolation and allow our members to experience independence, friendship and most importantly a sense of family and belonging.

It is imperative to acknowledge that our organization has survived entirely on the generosity of the public. Private donations represent 90% of our revenue; the other 10% is received from government sources. It has been a tremendous pleasure working with our cities finest philanthropists and dedicated volunteers who have helped make our organization what it is today. We truly wish to continue this invaluable relationship.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank, in advance, the members of our newsletter team who have met weekly to brainstorm ideas, write articles, and take photographs to make this newsletter a successful one.

One such prize, "Leaving on a Jet Plane," was for a trip for eight on a private jet to Acapulco. In addition, NHL alumni, Murray Wilson, signed up to take on the AC's wheelchair challenge in May, 2008. "Chair Aware" challenges Montrealers to spend a full day in a wheelchair. The crowd was extremely generous and the Centre reaped \$18,000 from this one gesture alone.

The “Chair Aware” challenge

There are thousands living with a physical disability in the Montreal area, yet accessibility is extremely limited. In fact, Montreal is the only major metropolitan cities in North America without full accessibility on its public transportation route. In general, people have little knowledge of the daily challenges faced by those with physical impairments. Getting to work, going to a restaurant or to the grocery store is sometimes so difficult that many people stay at home living in isolation. In order to raise money and awareness, the Action Centre launched the 'chair aware' challenge in 2006.

The event involves finding individuals to sign up and spend one day in a wheelchair. The participant will be asked to raise a minimum of \$2,000 in pledges for the Action Centre.

Tax receipts are issued for donations over \$20.00.

Last year's event was a success thanks to our partners Global TV and CJAD. Global TV's Jamie Orchard and CJAD's Andrew Carter took the challenge a second time and realized there was still so much to learn. Eighteen participants raised over \$72,000. The top earners were Diane Soroka from London Life (\$13,000) and Team Telus (\$10,000). The remaining \$49,000 was raised by the Montreal Canadiens Hockey Club (Pierre Boivin and Réjean Houle) as well as BMO, Alcan, RDS, CIBC Wood Gundy, National Bank, Lombard Odier and several other dedicated participants. We wish to thank all those involved especially our wheelchair sponsor Action-Médic.

The third annual 'chair aware' challenge will begin May 1st, 2008 and continue throughout the month of May, the Action Centre's Awareness month.
